SPECIFICATIONS

Grant applications approved by the Council and authorized from the fund for capital expenditures included, but were not limited to matching local funds for the consolidation of schools; the advancement of technology; capital losses as the result of natural disasters; infrastructure for fast-growing school systems or institutions; career technical facilities; public libraries; and capital needs to assist schools that are not accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. Grant applications were considered for capital expenditures between the amounts of \$25,000 to \$250,000 unless exceptional circumstances warranted an exception to the stated range of amounts. Applications were accepted September 17, 2007, through January 11, 2008.

14 Legislature and Act No. 1223 enacted at the 1975 Regular
15 Session of the Legislature.

16 (4) "1978 Act" means Act No. 138 enacted at the 1978
17 Second Special Session of the Legislature, as amended by Act

19 Legislature and Act No. 81-827 enacted at the 1981 Regular
20 Session of the Legislature.

19 (15) "Capital Improvement" means capital outlay
20 projects that include the planning, designing, inspection,
21 purchasing, construction, reconstruction, enlargement,
22 improvement, repair, or renovation of permanent buildings
23 containing classrooms, offices, libraries, laboratories,
24 clinical or teaching facilities, dormitories, vocational and
25 professional and industrial training facilities, cafeterias,

1 alternative schools, physical education facilities, research
 2 facilities, academic structures to reduce portable classrooms
 3 or substandard classroom facilities, related improvements and
 4 land as sites therefor, together with furnishings and
 5 equipment required for the operation of the facilities and the
 6 programs provided therein.

7 (16) "Commission" means the building commission
 8 created by Section 41-9-140 Code of Alabama 1975, and its
 9 successors as the state agency for awarding construction
 10 contracts and supervising construction.

11 (17) "Government Securities" means any bonds or
 12 other obligations which as to principal and interest
 13 constitute direct obligations of, or are unconditionally
 14 guaranteed by, the United States of America, including
 15 obligations of any federal agency to the extent such
 16 obligations are unconditionally guaranteed by the United
 17 States of America and any certificates or any other evidences
 18 of an ownership interest in such obligations of, or
 19 unconditionally guaranteed by, the United States of America or
 20 in specified portions thereof (which may consist of the
 21 principal thereof or the interest thereon).

22 (18) "Legislature" means the Legislature of Alabama.

23 (19) "Permitted Investments" means (i) Government
 24 Securities; (ii) bonds, debentures, notes or other evidences
 25 of indebtedness issued by any of the following agencies: Bank

1 for Cooperatives; Federal Intermediate Credit Banks; Federal
2 Financing Bank; Federal Home Loan Banks; Federal Farm Credit
3 Bank; Export-Import Bank of the United States; Federal Land
4 Banks; or Farmers Home Administration or any other agency or
5 corporation which has been or may hereafter be created by or
6 pursuant to an act of the Congress of the United States as an
7 agency or instrumentality thereof; (iii) bonds, notes, pass
8 through securities or other evidences of indebtedness of
9 Government National Mortgage Association and participation
10 certificates of Federal Home Loan Mortgage Corporation; (iv)
11 full faith and credit obligations of any state, provided that
12 at the time of purchase such obligations are rated at least
13 "AA" by Standard & Poor's Ratings Group and at least "Aa" by
14 Moody's Investors Service; (v) public housing bonds issued by
15 public agencies or municipalities and fully secured as to the
16 payment of both principal and interest by contracts with the
17 United States of America, or temporary notes, preliminary
18 notes or project notes issued by public agencies or
19 municipalities, in each case fully secured as to the payment
20 to both principal and interest by a requisition or payment
21 agreement with the United States of America; (vi) time
22 deposits evidenced by certificates of deposit issued by banks
23 or savings and loan associations which are members of the
24 Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation, provided that, to the
25 extent such time deposits are not covered by federal deposit

1 insurance, such time deposits (including interest thereon) are
2 fully secured by a pledge of obligations described in clauses
3 (i), (ii), (iii), and (v) above, which at all times have a
4 market value not less than the amount of such bank time
5 deposits required to be so secured and which meet the greater
6 of 100% collateralization or the "AA" collateral levels
7 established by Standard & Poor's Ratings Group for structured
8 financings; (vii) repurchase agreements for obligations of the
9 type specified in clauses (i), (ii), (iii), and (v) above,
10 provided such repurchase agreements are fully collateralized
11 and secured by such obligations which have a market value at
12 least equal to the purchase price of such repurchase
13 agreements which are held by a depository satisfactory to the
14 State Treasurer in such manner as may be required to provide a
15 perfected security interest in such obligations, and which
16 meet the greater of 100% collateralization or the "AA"
17 collateral levels established by Standard & Poor's Ratings
18 Group for structured financings; and (viii) uncollateralized
19 investment agreements with, or certificates of deposit issued
20 by, banks or bank holding companies, the senior long-term
21 securities of which are rated at least "AA" by Standard &
22 Poor's Ratings Group and at least "Aa" by Moody's Investors

24 (20) "Refunding Bonds" means those refunding bonds
25 issued under the provisions of this act.

1 (21) "State" means the State of Alabama.

2 (22) "Trust Fund" means the Education Trust Fund,
3 formerly designated as the Alabama Special Educational Trust
4 Fund, the name of which was changed to the Education Trust
5 Fund, effective October 1, 1996, pursuant to Act No. 95-264
6 enacted at the 1995 Regular Session of the Legislature.

7 Nouns and pronouns when used in this act shall be
8 deemed to include both singular and plural and all applicable
9 genders.

10 Section 3. Authorization to Issue Additional Bonds
11 and Purposes Thereof.

12 (a) The Authority is hereby authorized to sell and
13 issue its Bonds in the aggregate principal amount of
14 \$1,070,585,022 and to apply the proceeds as provided in this
15 act, to include the following purposes: paying the costs of
16 capital improvements for public education purposes in the
17 State; providing funds for capital improvements for the
18 Department of Youth Services; providing funds for capital
19 improvements for the Department of Rehabilitation Services;
20 providing funds to the Board of Trustees of the Alabama
21 Institute for Deaf and Blind for capital improvements and
22 fleet renewal; providing funds to the Two-year College System
23 and Athens State University for capital improvements;
24 providing funds for capital improvements to public
25 institutions of higher education; providing funds for capital

1 improvements for the Marine Environmental Sciences Consortium;
2 providing funds for capital improvements for the Alabama
3 Historical Commission; providing funds for capital
4 improvements for the Department of Forensic Sciences;
5 providing funds for capital improvements for a state
6 trooper/corrections training facility; providing funds for
7 capital improvements for the Department of Archives and
8 History; providing funds for capital improvements for
9 workforce development; providing funds for capital
10 improvements for the Alabama Technology Network; providing
11 funds for capital improvements for Tuskegee University; and
12 providing funds for the retirement of existing debt that has
13 been incurred by recipients of allocations to pay for capital
14 costs.

15 (b) The Bonds authorized by this act to be issued by
16 the Authority shall be in addition to all other bonds
17 previously authorized to be issued by it, and the powers
18 conferred on the Authority by this act are in addition to all
19 other powers heretofore conferred on the Authority by acts
20 heretofore enacted by the Legislature.

21 Section 4. Execution and Other Details of the Bonds.
22 The Bonds shall be signed by the president or vice-president
23 of the Authority, and the seal of the Authority affixed
24 thereto (or a facsimile thereof imprinted thereon) and
25 attested by its secretary. All signatures of the president,

1 vice-president, and secretary may be facsimile signatures if
2 the Authority, in its proceedings with respect to issuance,
3 provides for manual authentication (which may be in the form
4 of a certificate as to registration) of the Bonds by a
5 trustee, registrar or paying agent or by named individuals who
6 are employees of the State and who are assigned to the Finance
7 Department or State Treasurer's Office of the State. All Bonds
8 bearing signatures or facsimiles of the signatures of officers
9 of the Authority in office on the date of signing thereof
10 shall be valid and binding notwithstanding that before the
11 delivery thereof and payment therefor, any officer whose
12 signature appears thereon shall have ceased to be an officer
13 of the Authority. The Bonds and the income therefrom shall be
14 exempt from all taxation in the State of Alabama, may be used
15 as security for deposits, and shall be eligible for
16 investments of fiduciary funds, as provided in the 1965 Act.
17 The Bonds shall be construed to have all the qualities and
18 incidents of negotiable instruments subject to any
19 registration provisions pertaining to transfers. The Authority
20 and the Bonds shall be exempt from all laws of the State
21 governing usury including, without limitation, the provisions
22 of Title 8, Chapter 8, Code of Alabama 1975, or any subsequent
23 statute of similar import. The Bonds shall be in such form or
24 forms and denomination or denominations and of such tenor and
25 maturities, shall bear such rate or rates of interest payable

1 and evidenced in such manner, may be made subject to
2 redemption prior to their maturities, and may contain
3 provisions not inconsistent with this act, all as may be
4 provided by the resolution of the Authority under which the
5 Bonds may be issued; provided, that no Bonds shall have a
6 specified maturity date later than twenty years after their
7 date; and provided further, that those Bonds having maturities
8 more than ten years after their date shall be subject to
9 redemption at the option of the Authority on any date on and
10 after the tenth anniversary after their date at such
11 redemption price or prices and under such conditions as may be
12 prescribed in the proceedings of the Authority under which
13 they are issued. For the purpose of paying the principal of,
14 premium, if any, and interest on the Bonds or any Refunding
15 Bonds, the Authority shall designate the State Treasurer or
16 such bank or banks as the Authority, in its discretion,
17 determines to be appropriate and desirable. Funds for the
18 payment of debt service shall be transferred by the Authority
19 or the State Treasurer on behalf of the Authority to the
20 designated paying agent on the actual due date of such
21 principal, premium, if any, or interest.

22 Section 5. Sale of the Bonds. The Bonds may be sold
23 by the Authority from time to time in series, and if sold in
24 more than one series, may all be authorized in one initial
25 resolution of the Authority with the pledges therefor made by

1 the Authority in such initial resolution although some of the
2 details applicable to each series may be specified in the
3 respective resolutions under which the different series are
4 issued. The Authority, in the course of establishing, by
5 resolution, a principal amount of Bonds to be authorized for
6 sale at any given time, or to be sold in any series, may take
7 into account the existence of any unexpended proceeds of prior
8 issues of bonds of the Authority (and of any other issuer, if
9 such should be deemed by the Authority to be relevant), and
10 may structure the portions of the allocations provided for in
11 Section 9 of this act to be distributed from the proceeds of a
12 particular series (constituting less than all the Bonds
13 authorized by this act) as the Authority deems necessary or
14 prudent in order to enable the Authority to comply with any
15 tax covenants that may be required of it, or that may be
16 deemed by it to be prudent to be given by it, in connection
17 with the sale of any series of the Bonds. Each series of the
18 Bonds shall be sold competitively only at public sale, on
19 sealed bids which may be submitted either electronically or in
20 writing, after such advertisement as shall be prescribed by
21 the Authority and at such time or times as the Authority may
22 consider advantageous, to the bidder whose bid reflects the
23 lowest true interest cost to the Authority computed to the
24 respective maturities of the Bonds being sold (considering
25 mandatory redemption as scheduled maturity); provided, that if

1 no bid deemed acceptable by the Authority is received it may
2 reject all bids. The Authority may fix the method and the
3 terms and conditions under which the sale of any series of the
4 Bonds may otherwise be held; provided that such terms and
5 conditions shall not conflict with any requirement of this
6 act. Approval by the Governor of Alabama of the terms and
7 conditions under which any of the Bonds may be issued shall be
8 requisite to their validity. Before any series of the Bonds
9 shall be offered for sale by the Authority, the Governor shall
10 first determine that the issuance of that series of Bonds and
11 the application of the taxes pledged to the payment of the
12 principal of the Bonds as they mature and the interest thereon
13 as the same shall come due will not impair the adequacy of the
14 Trust Fund to pay appropriations therefrom and to support the
15 public schools and institutions of higher learning during the
16 period over which the Bonds will mature. The Governor's
17 determination in this regard shall be in writing signed by the
18 Governor and such determination shall be final and conclusive.
19 Neither a public hearing nor consent of the State Department
20 of Finance or any other department or agency shall be a
21 prerequisite to the issuance of any of the Bonds.

22 Section 6. Appropriation of Revenues to the
23 Authority; Pledge Thereof for the Benefit of the Bonds. For
24 the purpose of providing for payment of the principal, premium
25 (if any), and interest on the Bonds, and to accomplish the

1 objectives of this act, there is hereby irrevocably pledged to
2 those purposes, and hereby appropriated, such amount as may be
3 necessary therefor from the following sources:

4 (a) The residue of the receipts from the excise tax
5 ("the utility gross receipts tax") levied by Title 40, Chapter
6 21, Article 3, Code of Alabama 1975, as amended ("Article 3"),
7 remaining after payment of the expenses of administration and
8 enforcement of Article 3, being that portion of the tax that
9 is required by Article 3 to be deposited in the State Treasury
10 to the credit of the Trust Fund, after there shall have been
11 taken from the residue the amount necessary to pay at their
12 respective maturities the principal of and interest on those
13 bonds issued by the Authority under the 1965 Act, the 1971
14 Acts, the 1973 Act, the 1978 Act, the 1985 Act, the 1990 Act,
15 the 1995 Act, the 1998 Act, the 1999 Act, the 2001 Act, the
16 2002 Act, the 2003 Act, or this Act that may be outstanding at
17 the time of the delivery of the respective series of the Bonds
18 authorized herein;

19 (b) The residue of the receipts from the excise tax
20 ("the utility service use tax") levied by Title 40, Chapter
21 21, Article 4, Code of Alabama 1975 ("Article 4"), remaining
22 after payment of the expenses of administration and
23 enforcement of Article 4, being that portion of the tax that
24 is required by Article 4 to be deposited in the State Treasury
25 to the credit of the Trust Fund, after there shall have been

1 taken from the residue the amount necessary to pay at their
2 respective maturities the principal of and interest on those
3 bonds issued by the Authority under the 1965 Act, the 1971
4 Acts, the 1973 Act, the 1978 Act, the 1985 Act, the 1990 Act,
5 the 1995 Act, the 1998 Act, the 1999 Act, the 2001 Act, the
6 2002 Act, the 2003 Act, or this Act that may be outstanding at
7 the time of the delivery of the respective series of the Bonds
8 authorized herein;

9 (c) To the extent and to the extent only that the
10 revenues appropriated in the foregoing subsections (a) and (b)
11 of this Section may not be sufficient to pay at their
12 respective maturities the principal of, premium, if any, and
13 interest on the Bonds, the residue of the receipts from the
14 excise tax ("the sales tax") levied by Title 40, Chapter 23,
15 Article 1, Division 1, Code of Alabama 1975, as amended
16 ("Article 1"), after there shall have been taken from the
17 residue the amounts appropriated for other educational
18 purposes in Section 40-23-35, Code of Alabama 1975 (which
19 residue constitutes that portion of the receipts from the
20 sales tax that is now required by law to be paid into the
21 Trust Fund), and after there shall have been taken from the
22 residue amounts sufficient to meet all prior charges on the
23 residue including such amounts as may be necessary to pay at
24 their respective maturities the principal of and interest on
25 those bonds issued by the Authority under the 1965 Act, the

1 1971 Acts, the 1973 Act, the 1978 Act, the 1985 Act, the 1990
2 Act, the 1995 Act, the 1998 Act, the 1999 Act, the 2001 Act,
3 the 2002 Act, the 2003 Act, or this Act that may be
4 outstanding at the time of the delivery of the respective
5 series of the Bonds authorized herein; and

6 (d) To the extent and to the extent only that the
7 revenues appropriated in the foregoing subsections (a), (b),
8 and (c) of this Section may not be sufficient to pay at their
9 respective maturities the principal of, premium, if any, and
10 the interest on the Bonds, the residue of the receipts from
11 the excise tax ("the use tax") levied by Title 40, Chapter 23,
12 Article 2, Code of Alabama 1975, as amended ("Article 2"),
13 after there shall have been taken from the residue the amount
14 necessary to meet the expenses of the State Department of
15 Revenue in collecting the use tax (which residue constitutes
16 that portion of the receipts from the use tax that is now
17 required by law to be paid into the Trust Fund), and after
18 there shall have been taken from the residue such amounts as
19 may be necessary to meet all prior charges on the use tax
20 including the amounts sufficient to pay at their respective
21 maturities the principal of and interest on those outstanding
22 bonds referred to in subsection (c) of this Section.

23 All monies hereby appropriated and pledged shall
24 constitute a sinking fund for the purpose of paying the
25 principal of, premium, if any, and interest on the Bonds. The

1 State Treasurer is authorized and directed to pay at their
2 respective maturities the principal of, premium, if any, and
3 interest on the Bonds out of this fund and out of the residues
4 of the tax receipts herein appropriated and pledged for the
5 benefit of the Bonds, and is further authorized and directed
6 to set up and maintain appropriate records pertaining thereto.

7 Section 7. Bonds to be Payable Solely out of the
8 Revenues Appropriated; Authorization for Authority to Pledge
9 Such Revenues for the Bonds. The Bonds shall not be general
10 obligations of the Authority but shall be limited obligations
11 payable solely out of the residues of the tax receipts
12 appropriated and pledged in Section 6 of this act. All Bonds
13 issued by the Authority pursuant to the provisions of this act
14 shall be solely and exclusively obligations of the Authority
15 and shall not constitute or create an obligation or debt of
16 the State. As security for the payment of the principal of,
17 premium, if any, and interest on the Bonds, the Authority is
18 hereby authorized and empowered to pledge the residues of the
19 tax receipts that are appropriated and pledged in Section 6
20 hereof for such purposes. All such pledges made by the
21 Authority shall take precedence in the order of the adoption
22 of the resolutions containing the pledges. All such pledges
23 shall be prior and superior to any pledges that may be made
24 for any refunding bonds hereafter issued by the Authority
25 under the provisions of any of the 1965 Act, the 1971 Acts,

1 the 1973 Act, the 1978 Act, the 1985 Act, the 1990 Act, the
2 1995 Act, the 1998 Act, the 1999 Act, the 2001 Act, the 2002
3 Act, the 2003 Act or any other act heretofore enacted.

4 Section 8. Refunding Bonds. For the purpose of
5 refunding any Bonds or Refunding Bonds of the Authority issued
6 under the provisions of this act, the 1965 Act, the 1971 Acts,
7 the 1973 Act, the 1978 Act, the 1985 Act, the 1990 Act, the
8 1995 Act, the 1998 Act, the 1999 Act, the 2001 Act, the 2002
9 Act or the 2003 Act or any other act previously enacted, or
10 any combination thereof, whether such refunding shall occur
11 before, at or after the maturity of the Bonds refunded and for
12 the purpose of paying all premiums and expenses of such
13 refunding (including, but not limited to, attorneys' fees,
14 costs of printing the Refunding Bonds, fiscal agents' fees,
15 and accountants' fees), the Authority is hereby authorized to
16 sell and issue its Refunding Bonds. Such Refunding Bonds may
17 be sold and issued from time to time, at public sale, on
18 sealed bids and on such other terms and conditions as the
19 Authority shall determine to be advantageous and shall adopt
20 and provide for in its proceedings for the sale and issuance
21 of such Refunding Bonds. Provided, however, no Refunding Bonds
22 shall be issued unless the present value of all debt service
23 on the Refunding Bonds (computed with a discount rate equal to
24 the true interest rate of the Refunding Bonds and taking into
25 account all underwriting discount and other issuance expenses)

1 shall not be greater than 95 percent of the present value of
2 all debt service on the Bonds to be refunded (computed using
3 the same discount rate and taking into account the
4 underwriting discount and other issuance expenses originally
5 applicable to such Bonds) determined as if such Bonds to be
6 refunded were paid and retired in accordance with the schedule
7 of maturities (considering mandatory redemption as scheduled
8 maturity) provided at the time of their issuance. Provided
9 further that the average maturity of the Refunding Bonds, as
10 measured from the date of issuance of such Refunding Bonds,
11 shall not exceed by more than three years the average maturity
12 of the Bonds to be refunded, as also measured from such date
13 of issuance, with the average maturity of any principal amount
14 of Bonds to be determined by multiplying the principal of each
15 maturity by the number of years (including any fractional part
16 of a year) intervening between such date of issuance and each
17 such maturity, taking the sum of all such products, and then
18 dividing such sum by the aggregate principal amount of Bonds
19 for which the average maturity is to be determined. For the
20 purpose of providing funds to enable the Authority to pay at
21 their respective maturities the principal of, premium, if any,
22 and interest on the Refunding Bonds issued under this act, the
23 Authority is hereby authorized to pledge irrevocably for such
24 purpose, and there is hereby appropriated for such purpose,
25 such amount as may be necessary of the residues of the

1 receipts from the excise taxes pledged and appropriated in
2 subsections (a), (b), (c), and (d) of Section 6 of this act,
3 any reserves or sinking funds established by the Authority, as
4 well as revenues of the Authority from any other sources
5 specified in the proceedings wherein the Refunding Bonds are
6 authorized to be issued. Pending the application of the
7 proceeds of Refunding Bonds issued in accordance with this
8 Section, the proceeds, together with investment earnings
9 therefrom, and amounts in any sinking fund, together with
10 investment earnings thereon, may be held by the State
11 Treasurer as treasurer of the Authority in trust, or may be
12 deposited by the State Treasurer in trust, on such terms as
13 the State Treasurer and the Authority shall approve, with a
14 trustee or escrow agent, which trustee or escrow agent shall
15 be a banking institution or trust company authorized to
16 exercise trust powers in Alabama, for investment in Permitted
17 Investments. Proceeds of Refunding Bonds shall be so invested
18 and applied as to assure that the principal, interest, and
19 redemption premium, if any, on the Bonds being refunded shall
20 be paid in full on the respective maturity, redemption, or
21 interest payment dates. Refunding Bonds issued by the
22 Authority shall not be general obligations of the Authority
23 but shall be payable solely from the sources specified in this
24 act and in the proceedings whereby the Refunding Bonds are
25 authorized to be issued. All Refunding Bonds issued by the

1 Authority shall be solely and exclusively obligations of the
2 Authority and shall not create debts of the State of Alabama.
3 The faith and credit of the State of Alabama shall never be
4 pledged for the payment of any Refunding Bonds issued by the
5 Authority under this act. The Authority may contract with
6 respect to the safekeeping and application of the proceeds of
7 Refunding Bonds and other funds included therewith and the
8 income therefrom, and shall have the right and power to
9 appoint a trustee therefore, which may be any bank or company
10 authorized to exercise trust powers and located within and/or
11 without the State. All other provisions of this act shall
12 apply to the Refunding Bonds issued hereunder except (a) the
13 limitation contained in Section 3 of this act on the amount of
14 Bonds that may be issued under this act and (b) the provisions
15 of Section 9 of this act. All pledges made by this act, or by
16 the Authority pursuant to the provisions of this act, for the
17 benefit of Refunding Bonds issued under this act, and all such
18 pledges for the benefit of Refunding Bonds which may be issued
19 to refund any bonds issued under any of the 1965 Act, the 1971
20 Acts, the 1973 Act, the 1978 Act, the 1985 Act, the 1990 Act,
21 the 1995 Act, the 1998 Act, the 1999 Act, the 2001 Act, the
22 2002 Act, the 2003 Act, or this Act, shall take precedence in
23 the order of the adoption of the resolutions authorizing the
24 issuance of such Refunding Bonds. Bonds refunded prior to
25 their maturity with the proceeds of Refunding Bonds shall be

1 deemed paid and the pledges herein and by the Authority made
2 for the payment thereof defeased if the Authority, in its
3 proceedings regarding issuance of the Refunding Bonds shall
4 provide for and establish a trust or escrow fund comprised of
5 monies or Government Securities, or both, sufficient to pay,
6 when due, the entire principal of, premium, if any, and
7 interest on the Bonds to be refunded thereby; provided, that
8 such Government Securities shall not be subject to redemption
9 prior to their maturities other than at the option of the
10 holder thereof. Upon the establishment of such a trust or
11 escrow fund, the refunded Bonds shall no longer be deemed to
12 be outstanding, shall no longer be secured by the funds
13 pledged therefor in Section 6 of this act, shall no longer be
14 obligations of the Authority and shall be secured solely by
15 and payable from monies and Government Securities deposited in
16 such trust or escrow fund.

17 Section 9. Use of Bond Proceeds.

18 (a) The proceeds derived from each sale of the Bonds
19 issued pursuant to this act shall be deposited in the State
20 Treasury and shall be carried in a separate fund therein for
21 the account of the Authority, which shall pay the expenses of
22 issuance therefrom. The expenses of issuance of the Bonds
23 shall be prorated among the recipients of the proceeds from
24 the sale of the Bonds in proportions they receive allocations
25 of the proceeds thereunder. The proceeds from the sale of the

1 Bonds remaining after payment of the expenses of issuance
 2 thereof shall be retained in said fund and, until they are
 3 paid out, shall be invested by the State Treasurer at the
 4 direction of the Authority in Permitted Investments maturing
 5 at such time or times as the Authority shall direct.

6 (b) Proceeds from the sale of the Bonds and the
 7 earnings thereon shall be paid out from time to time on orders
 8 or warrants issued by or at the direction of the Authority for
 9 any one or more of the purposes specified in this act, to
 10 include the following allocations:

11 (1) \$658,640,517 to be allocated and expended on
 12 behalf of the K-12 public education in this state as follows:

13 a. Two hundred thousand dollars to be allocated and
 14 expended on behalf of each local board of education in the
 15 state to pay the cost of capital improvements.

16 b. Two hundred ninety five million sixteen thousand
 17 four hundred six dollars (\$295,016,406) to be allocated and
 18 expended on behalf of local boards of education, pro rata,
 19 based on the 2006-2007 first 20 scholastic days after Labor
 20 Day of average daily membership of public schools, to pay the
 21 cost of capital improvements.

22 c. Two hundred ninety five million sixteen thousand
 23 four hundred six dollars (\$295,016,406) to be allocated and
 24 expended on behalf of local boards of education, pro-rata,
 25 based on each local board's share of the allocation of the

1 Public School Fund for the fiscal year ending September 30,
2 2008, to pay the cost of capital improvements.

3 d. Fifteen million dollars (\$15,000,000) of the
4 proceeds derived from the sale of the Bonds to be allocated
5 and expended from time to time on orders of the Authority for
6 the Black Belt School Systems to pay the cost of capital
7 improvements. The State Superintendent of Education shall
8 oversee the expenditure of these bond proceeds, the allocation
9 of which shall be based on average daily membership for the
10 2006-2007 first 20 scholastic days after Labor Day in the
11 Bullock County School System; Choctaw County School System;
12 Dallas County School System; Demopolis City School System;
13 Greene County School System; Hale County School System; Linden
14 City School System; Lowndes County School System; Macon County
15 School System; Marengo County School System; Perry County
16 School System; Pickens County School System; Selma City School
17 System; Sumter County School System; and Wilcox County School
18 System (Black Belt School Systems). Consideration shall be
19 given to individual schools within each school system that are
20 not accredited by Southern Association of Colleges and Schools
21 if capital expenditures would assist in obtaining
22 accreditation.

23 e. \$13,405,923 of the proceeds derived from the
24 sale of the Bonds to be allocated to the following school sys-
25 tems that have experienced catastrophic loss due to hurri-

1 canes, tornadoes and fire to pay the costs of capital improve-
 2 ments.

6 g. One million twenty eight thousand one hundred
7 twelve dollars (\$1,028,112) of the proceeds derived from the
8 sale of the Bonds to be expended from time to time on orders
9 of the Authority for the Alabama School of Mathematics and
10 Science to pay the cost of capital improvements.

11 h. Eleven million dollars (\$11,000,000) of the
12 proceeds derived from the sale of the Bonds to be expended
13 from time to time on orders of the Authority for the purpose
14 of providing technology funds to local school systems based
15 upon the recommendation of the State Superintendent of
16 Education. The State Superintendent of Education shall take
17 into consideration technology needs of those schools that are
18 not accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and
19 Schools. Such funds shall be used to pay the cost of capital
20 improvements.

21 i. Eight hundred fifty nine thousand five hundred
22 ninety four dollars (\$859,594) of the proceeds derived from
23 the sale of the Bonds to be expended from time to time on or-
24 ders of the Authority for the purpose of providing funds to

1 the following local school systems to pay the cost of capital
 2 improvements.

8 (j) If the City of Saraland receives final approval

15 (2) Forty eight million two hundred seven thousand
 16 five hundred dollars (\$48,207,500) to be allocated and
 17 expended on behalf of the Postsecondary Education Department
 18 for Athens State University and the community, junior, and
 19 technical colleges operated under the auspices of the State
 20 Board of Education for capital improvements as follows:

1 a. Two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) to be
 2 allocated and expended on behalf of each two-year college and
 3 Athens State University.

4 b. \$21,403,750 shall be allocated and expended on
 5 behalf of the two-year colleges and Athens State University,
 6 pro rata, based on each college's share of basic Operations
 7 and Maintenance allocations for FY 2006-2007.

8 c. \$21,403,750 shall be allocated and expended on
 9 behalf of the two-year colleges and Athens State University,
 10 pro rata, based on the proportion that each college's Fall
 11 2006 Full-time Equivalent Student population bears to the
 12 System's total Full-time Equivalent Student population.

13 (3) a. \$178,237,005 to be allocated and expended for
 14 capital improvements on behalf of higher education to colleges
 15 and universities as follows:

6 b. Of the above allocation to Alabama A & M,
7 \$365,000 is designated to satisfy in full the obligation of
8 the State under the Order entered in Knight v. Alabama and
9 payment will be subject to the conditions for payment provided
10 in that Order.

11 c. Of the above allocation to Alabama State
12 University, \$11,890,380 is designated to satisfy in full the
13 obligation of the State under the Order entered in Knight v.
14 Alabama and payment will be subject to the conditions for
15 payment provided by that Order.

16 (4) One million dollars (\$1,000,000) to be allocated
17 and expended on behalf of the Marine Environmental Sciences
18 Consortium, otherwise known as the Dauphin Island Sea Lab, for
19 capital improvements.

20 (5) Fourteen million dollars (\$14,000,000) to be
21 allocated and expended on behalf of the Department of Youth

1 Services for capital improvements, including local juvenile
2 detention facilities.

3 (6) Four million five hundred thousand dollars
4 (\$4,500,000) to be allocated and expended on behalf of the
5 Board of Trustees of the Alabama Institute for Deaf and Blind
6 for capital improvements and fleet renewal at the Institute.

7 (7) Eleven million dollars (\$11,000,000) to be
8 allocated and expended on behalf of the Department of
9 Rehabilitation Services for capital improvements.

10 (8) One million five hundred thousand dollars
11 (\$1,500,000) to the Alabama Historical Commission for capital
12 improvements.

13 (9) One million five hundred thousand dollars
14 (\$1,500,000) to be allocated and expended on behalf of the
15 Department of Archives and History for capital improvements.

16 (10) Twenty million dollars (\$20,000,000) to be
17 allocated and expended for capital improvements needed in
18 connection with carrying out the obligations of the State to
19 provide training and facilities for training workers for new
20 and expanded industries in the State.

21 (11) Nine million five hundred thousand dollars
22 (\$9,500,000) to be allocated and expended for capital
23 improvements for the Alabama Technology Network (ATN). The
24 allotment of \$9,500,000 shall be used for the purpose of
25 funding Interactive Digital Centers (IDC). Each IDC shall

1 support, but not be limited to, Just In Time learning,
2 simulation-based workforce development, distance learning, and
3 creation of interactive three and four dimensional objects.
4 Each IDC shall partner with private investment for matching
5 funds at a three to one ratio in order to equip the IDC. IDC
6 site selection shall be designated by the president of the
7 Alabama Technology Network.

8 (12) Seven million dollars (\$7,000,000) to be
9 allocated and expended for Forensic Sciences at Auburn
10 University for capital improvements.

11 (13) Four million dollars (\$4,000,000) to be
12 allocated and expended for Forensic Sciences at the University
13 of South Alabama for capital improvements.

14 (14) Thirty two million dollars (\$32,000,000) to be
15 allocated and expended for the Enterprise City School System
16 in accordance with Act No. 2007-133.

17 (15) Twenty four million five hundred thousand
18 dollars (\$24,500,000) to be allocated and expended for capital
19 improvements for a state trooper/corrections training
20 facility.

21 (16) \$55,000,000 to be allocated to the Alabama
22 Public School and College Education Incentive Fund to be
23 expended in accordance with Section 10 of this act.

24 (c) The provision for the use of proceeds for the
25 purposes specified in Section 9(b) notwithstanding, it shall

1 be a permitted use of bond proceeds, not to exceed fifty
2 percent of the amount allocated by this act, by a recipient to
3 retire existing indebtedness that has been incurred by the
4 recipient to pay for capital improvements. However, as much as
5 necessary of the bond proceeds for the Marine Environmental
6 Sciences Consortium and the Alabama School of Mathematics and
7 Science may be used to retire existing indebtedness. The use
8 of bond proceeds for this purpose shall require specific
9 approval of the Authority and shall be subject to the
10 Authority's policies and rules governing this use.

11 Section 10. (a) There is hereby created the Alabama
12 Public School and College Education Incentive Fund (Incentive
13 Fund). Fifty five million dollars (\$55,000,000) from the first
14 series of bonds issued pursuant to this act shall be deposited
15 into the Incentive Fund.

16 (b) There is hereby created the Alabama Public
17 School and College Education Incentive Fund Council. The
18 Council shall be made up of the State Superintendent of
19 Education; the Director of Finance; one member, who shall not
20 be an elected official, appointed by the Governor; the
21 Lieutenant Governor; the Chair of the Senate Finance and
22 Taxation-Education Committee; and the Chair of the House
23 Education Appropriations Committee. The Lieutenant Governor
24 and legislative members of the Council shall be entitled to
25 their regular per diem when attending Council meetings. The

1 Council created by this section shall allocate capital
2 expenditures from the Alabama Public School and College
3 Education Incentive Fund. Authorized expenditures from the
4 Incentive Fund shall include, but not be limited to, matching
5 local funds for the consolidation of schools; the advancement
6 of technology; capital losses as the result of natural
7 disasters; infrastructure for fast growing school systems or
8 institutions; career technical facilities; public libraries;
9 and capital needs to assist schools that are not accredited by
10 the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. Entities
11 applying for grants from the Incentive Fund shall make
12 application to members of the Council. The Council may require
13 local match for certain capital projects. Upon the deposit of
14 the monies into the Incentive Fund, the Council shall meet at
15 least quarterly to consider grant applications. Four members
16 of the Council shall constitute a quorum and four members must
17 be present and vote affirmatively for the approval of any
18 grant application. The Council shall hold its first meeting
19 within the first quarter following the deposit of the first
20 monies into the Incentive Fund. The Council shall elect a
21 chairperson at the first meeting. The chairperson shall call
22 subsequent meetings of the Council. If the chairperson fails
23 to call a meeting at least quarterly, a meeting shall be held
24 upon a written request by at least four members of the
25 Council.

1 Section 11. Not later than three years following
2 allocation of Bond proceeds as provided herein, the Authority
3 shall review the status of any unexpended allocations, and, at
4 its sole discretion, determine if unexpended allocations or
5 any portion thereof shall revert to the Authority for
6 reallocation by the Alabama Public School and College
7 Education Incentive Fund Council.

8 Section 12. Notwithstanding any of the foregoing and
9 in addition to all powers heretofore granted to the Authority,
10 the Authority is hereby expressly authorized to use the
11 proceeds derived from the sale of Bonds and income on
12 Permitted Investments in accordance with the provisions of
13 this act. The preparation of all plans and specifications for
14 any building constructed wholly or in part with any of the
15 monies realized from the sale of any of the Bonds and all work
16 done pursuant to expenditure of the proceeds thereof in regard
17 to the construction, reconstruction, alteration, improvement,
18 and equipping of buildings shall be supervised by the State
19 Building Commission, and the Authority will reimburse the
20 Commission for its reasonable direct and administrative costs
21 in having plans, specifications, and contract documents
22 prepared and in supervising and inspecting the work.
23 Additionally, the Authority is hereby expressly permitted to
24 pay to the Department of Finance and the State Treasurer's
25 Office, from time to time and from any funds available to the

1 Authority, amounts to offset costs incurred in the
2 administration of the business of the Authority. The cost of
3 such compensation shall be prorated among the recipients of
4 proceeds of the Bonds in the same manner as the expenses of
5 issuance of the Bonds are required hereby to be prorated.

6 Section 13. The Authority shall hire or contract
7 with businesses or individuals which reflect the racial and
8 ethnic diversity of the State.

9 Section 14. Tax Exemption. The Authority shall have
10 the power to make such payments to the United States of
11 America as the board of directors of the Authority deems
12 necessary to cause the interest on any bonds of the Authority,
13 including the Bonds, to be and remain exempt from, or
14 excludible from gross income for purposes of, federal income
15 taxation. The Authority shall have the power to make such
16 agreements respecting the investment of funds of the Authority
17 as the Authority shall deem necessary in order that the
18 interest income on bonds of the Authority be and remain exempt
19 from, or excludible from gross income for purposes of, federal
20 income taxation.

21 Section 15. Issuance Expenses; Contracts and
22 Appointments. The Authority is authorized to pay out of
23 proceeds of any series of Bonds the costs and expenses
24 incurred in connection with the issuance of such Bonds,
25 including without limitation legal and accounting fees and

1 expenses, fees and expenses of any financial or fiscal advisor
2 employed by the Authority, printing costs, rating agency fees,
3 and premiums or charges for any credit enhancement or
4 liquidity providers. Notwithstanding any provision of this act
5 or the 1965 Act, in appointing, employing, or contracting with
6 attorneys, fiscal advisers, trustees, paying agents,
7 investment bankers, banks and underwriters, the Authority may
8 appoint, employ or contract with firms whose principal offices
9 are located without or within Alabama. The Authority shall
10 hire or contract with attorneys, fiscal advisors, trustees,
11 paying agents, investment bankers, banks, and underwriters
12 which shall reflect the racial and ethnic diversity of the
13 state. The Authority shall issue Requests For Proposals for
14 attorneys, fiscal advisors, trustees, paying agents,
15 investment bankers, banks, and underwriters. The Authority
16 shall evaluate each proposed bid publicly and award each
17 contract publicly. Minutes of the Authority's meeting shall
18 record the reasons for awarding each contract.

19 Section 16. Severability. In the event any section,
20 sentence, clause or provision of this act shall be declared
21 invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such action
22 shall not affect the validity of the remaining sections,
23 sentences, clauses, or provisions of this act, which shall
24 continue effective.

1 Section 17. Effective Date. This act shall become
2 effective immediately upon its passage and approval by the
3 Governor or upon its otherwise becoming a law.
