

dead."



- I believe all students should be civically minded socially conscious change agents in their community.



AMECHILDREN BEING PUSHED & PRISON?

THE PIPELINE TO PRISON: THE U.S. HAS THE HIGHEST INCARCERATION RATE IN THE WORLD, AND ITS PRISONS AND JAILS ARE OVERWHELMINGLY FILLED WITH AFRICAN AMERICANS

FROM SCHOOL TO PRISON

STUDENTS OF COLOR FACE HARSHER DISCIPLINE AND ARE MORE LIKELY TO BE PUSHED OUT OF SCHOOL THAN WHITES.



OF STUDENTS EXPELLED FROM U.S. SCHOOLS EACH YEAR



OF STUDENTS INVOLVED IN "IN-SCHOOL" ARRESTS OR REFERRED TO LAW ENFORCEMENT



BLACK STUDENTS ARE THREE AND A HALF TIMES MORE LIKELY TO BE SUSPENDED THAN WHITES.



BLACK AND LATINO STUDENTS ARETWICE AS LIKELY TO NOT GRADUATE HIGH SCHOOL AS WHITES.

FROM FOSTER CARE TO PRISON





Physiological Needs

- Food, Water, Shelter, Clothing
 - The human body can't function at optimal performance if these basic physiological needs are not satisfied.



Safety Needs

- Physical Safety
 - Gang violence, Bullying
- Emotional Safety
 - Safe Space



Love and Belonging (Trauma Informed Care)

- You can't view your students as criminals, convicts, or thugs.
- A student does not care about learning if he or she believes they are not loved and do not belong in your learning environment
- They don't care how much you know until they know how much you care
- Nothing is more important than what students see, hear, feel, or experience in the classroom







- Do you know your students and their experiences?
- Do you empathize instead of sympathize?
- Do your lessons take into account your students and their experiences to make them feel good about themselves?






Self Actualization


• Self Actualization could be measured through the concept of peak experiences. This occurs when a person experiences the world totally for what it is, and there are feelings of joy and euphoria








Being Culturally Responsive is not teaching based on stereotypes and race but on building relationships and getting to know your students and their likes, interests, history and cultural norms















Final Thoughts
