## First Look at Educator Prep Report Cards, FY20 Budget Request

State Superintendent Dr. Eric Mackey unveiled the new Educator Preparation Institutional Report Card during the Sept. 13 State Board of Education work session, ahead of a public release. This is the first report card for colleges and universities graduating teacher candidates since 2009 and includes 2016-17 data on first-year teachers from undergraduate and graduate programs. The report shows how many attempts it took candidates from each institution to pass teacher certification tests and includes results of a first-year teacher survey completed by teachers and their school principals/employers. The survey questions attempt to measure how prepared teachers are in their first year of teaching. The instrument was created by the Alabama Association of Colleges for Teacher Education and administered by the Alabama State Department of Education.

Mackey said he is pleased with the report card overall, adding that the results show that content knowledge and knowing *how* to teach are both important. He said the information can be used to highlight challenges each institution can address. Report cards for each institution are <u>posted on the ALSDE website</u>.

Also at the work session, Mackey presented a <u>proposed FY20 education budget request</u>, which includes \$158 million in proposed increases. Mackey said he developed the budget priorities from state board members and local superintendent input.

State board members identified seven funding priorities:

1) **Literacy/Reading** -\$5 million increase for dyslexia support and Alabama Reading Initiative

2) **Numeracy/Mathematics** -\$2 million increase to support the new math standards/ curriculum

3) Jobs for Alabama Graduates (JAG) -\$1 million increase

4) **Career Technical Education (CTE)** - \$1 million increase

5) **Other Current Expense (OCE)** - \$39.8 million increase, half of which would go to support school safety initiatives recommend-

ed by Gov. Kay Ivey's SAFE Council6) National Board Certified Teachers -

- (NBCT) \$100,000 increase
- Divisors/Smaller Class Size \$21.9 million increase to add some 243 new teachers in grades 4-6

Local superintendents identified an additional five funding priorities:

1) **Transportation** - \$11 million increase (\$5 million for new buses; \$6 million for operations)

2) **Nurses** - \$30 million increase (an offset to the \$35 million in local revenue school systems currently spend on exploding health needs instead of academic programs)

3) English Language Learners (ELL) - \$9 million increase (support for students do not speak English as their first language)
4) Special Education Preschool - \$16.8 million increase (funding required for 3- and 4year-old children identified with special needs)
5) "1%" Salary Line- \$20 million increase (funding to support personnel contracts that exceed 9 months)

The proposal also seeks increases to the Foundation's State Instructional Support:

• Student Materials from \$536.00 to \$600/ unit

• Technology from \$300 to \$350/unit

• **Professional Development** from \$90 to \$100/unit

• Library Enhancement from \$96 to \$200/ unit

• Textbooks from \$70 to \$75/ADM

The board will vote on the proposed budget at its October meeting.

Three personnel recommendations were approved at the board meeting by a 5-0 vote, with Stephanie Bell abstaining. Two of the hires already are serving in their new roles: Dr. Jeff Langham as chief of staff and Dr. Tony Thacker as the assistant state superintendent of Evaluation and Innovation. Current Eufaula City Schools Superintendent Dr. Elizabeth Davis will join the department in October as the assistant state superintendent of Instruction

In other business, the board <u>received recommendations</u> for the adoption of textbooks for Digital Literacy and Computer Science, grades k-12. In addition, the board approved the following Alabama Administrative Code changes:

• <u>Apportionment of Funds:</u> Changes needed to reflect the enacted FY19 budget and lower divisors for grades 4-6 and permit flexibility for fleet renewal funds.

• <u>Alabama High School Diploma:</u> Language for mathematics-credit eligible and science-credit eligible replaces "equivalent" courses.

• <u>Dual Enrollment</u>: Language clarifies agreements between two-year colleges/universities and local school systems for awarding credit. The responsibility for course content, student placement and quality of instruction rests with the institution of higher education.

## How County Boards Should Raise Their Salaries

Is your county school board considering a salary raise? This act may only be taken up in November during the required meeting allowing the public to address the board about the allotment of public funds and other board matters relating to Ala. Code §16-8-3. Board members can receive compensation of up to \$600 a month, unless a higher figure is set by a local act according to Ala. Code §16-1-26. This figure does not include expenses such as traveling and transacting board business.

The raise would go into effect when the next board member begins a new term in office. Please contact AASB at 334-277-9700 if you have questions.
