# Ivey Requests Revisions to ALSDE Reopening Roadmap, Funding Requests

A marathon work session following Tuesday's State Board of Education meeting was devoted exclusively to discussion of the ALSDE's Roadmap for Reopening Schools, which was released late last month. The plan provides suggested guidance but largely leaves key decisions such as mandating facial coverings to each local school system.

Board members received a report on a health-focused reopening plan developed by a bi-partisan group of senators. That plan includes hiring 300 school nurses, technology to provide thermal scanning devices for students and staff, testing for flu and COVID-19 and a nurse's station in each K-12 school. The \$150 million plan would be paid for out of \$1.8 billion the state received in federal CARES Act funding.

Ivey directed the ALSDE to review elements of the Senate plan for potential inclusion in the Reopening Roadmap and revisit the department's funding request for COVID-19-related expenses to be paid from federal CARES Act funds that must be spent by Dec. 31.
