SBOE Reviews Strategic Plan, Discusses Statewide Virtual Option for Upcoming School Year

The State Board of Education met for a blended in-person and virtual board meeting and work session Thursday. Board actions included the approval of seven educator preparation programs and a robust discussion about ensuring the requirements of the Alabama Literacy Act are being met.

The work session following the board's meeting included a review of the department's strategic plan, Alabama Achieves, a demo of the new ALSDE website and discussion about the status of a statewide virtual option for the upcoming school year.

Public Consulting Group (PCG) representatives were on hand to provide an update about the second phase of work to help implement recommendations from its organizational and efficiency review of the ALSDE. Collaboration has begun between PCG and state board members as well as weekly Friday morning meetings with ALSDE staff.
