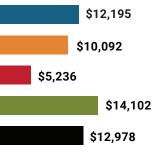

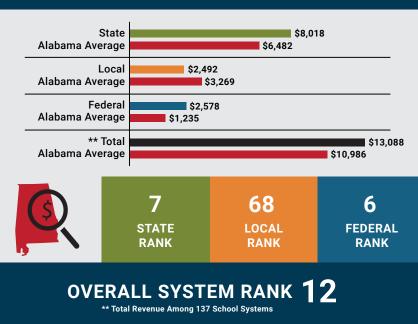
Total Per-Pupil Expenditures (PPE)





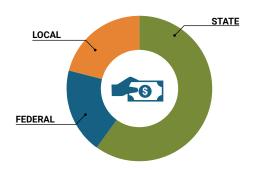
Per-Pupil Revenue Sources
