


Per Pupil Expenditures among 137 systems



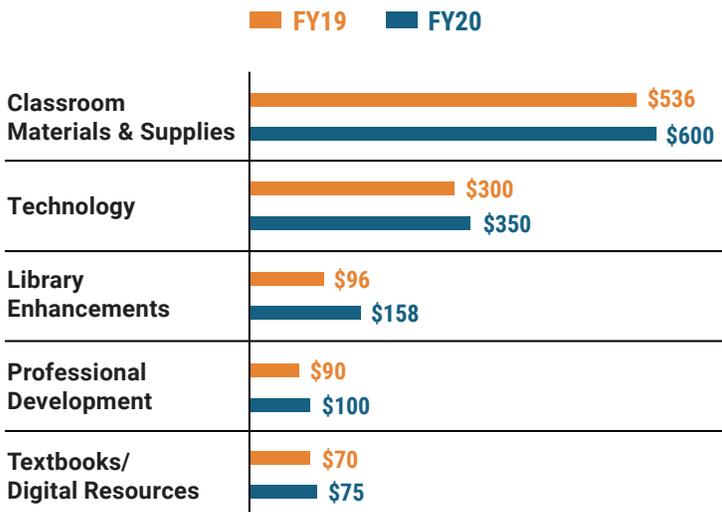




Only 4% of state funding goes to Non-Personnel Operations
