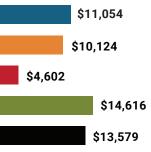

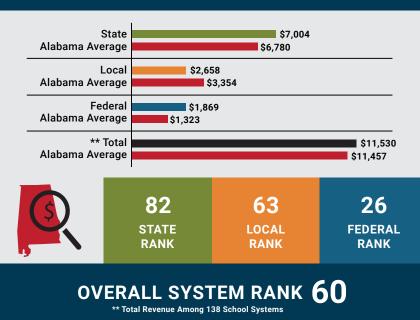
# Total Per-Pupil Expenditures (PPE)





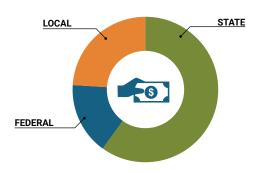
## **Per-Pupil Revenue Sources**
