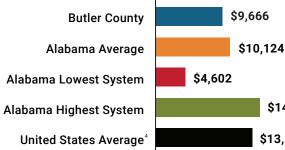

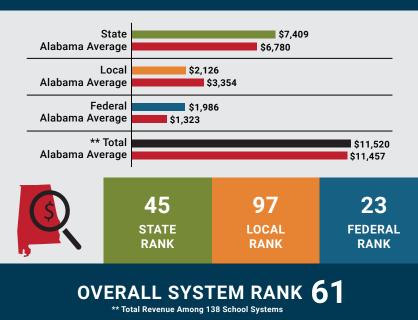
#### **Total Per-Pupil Expenditures** (PPE)





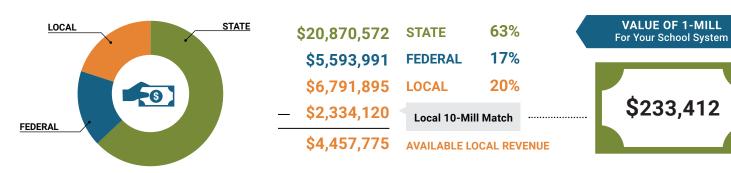
## **Per-Pupil Revenue Sources**
