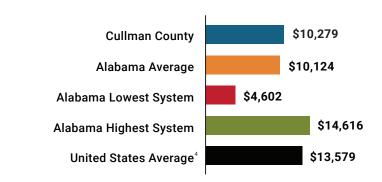

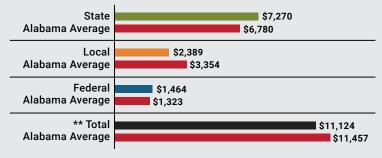

#### How was your school system funded?1

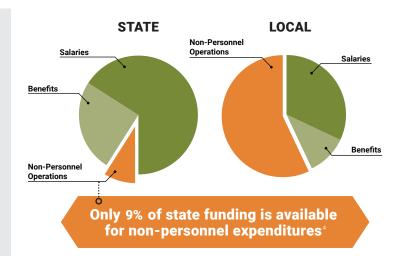

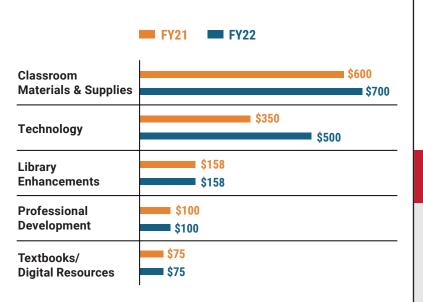
How did your school system spend state & local dollars?<sup>1</sup>
