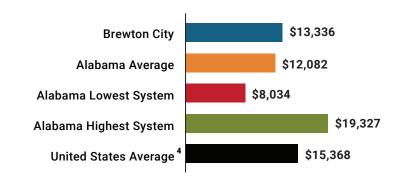

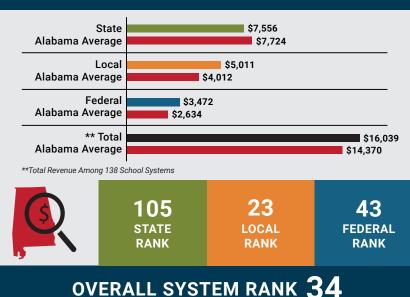

Per-Pupil Revenue Sources

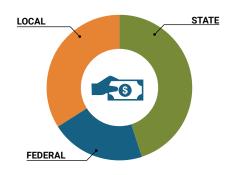
Brewton City Revenue Sources
