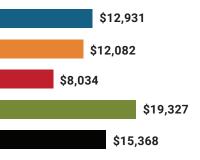

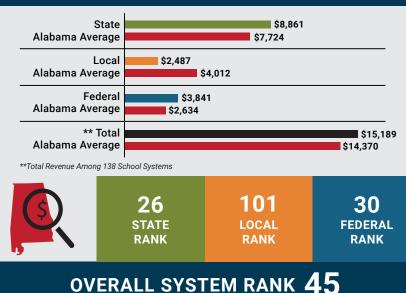
# Total Per-Pupil Expenditures (PPE)





### **Per-Pupil Revenue Sources**

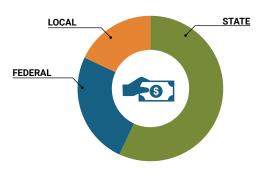
#### Gadsden City Revenue Sources

#### How did your school system spend state & local dollars?<sup>1</sup>

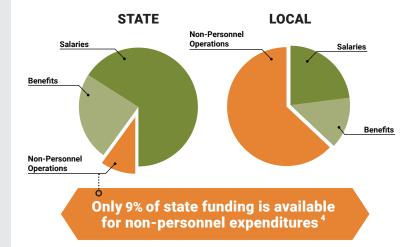
