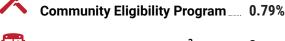
Cost of One Month's Operation/General Fund

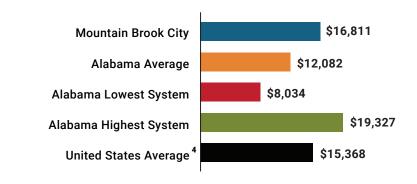

#### How was your school system funded?<sup>1</sup>

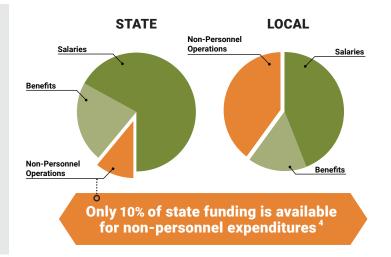

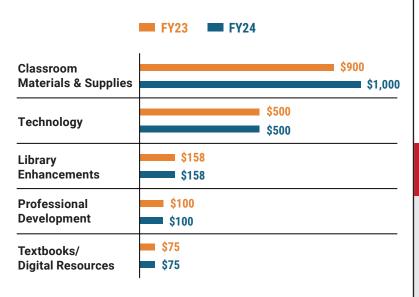
