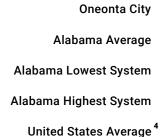

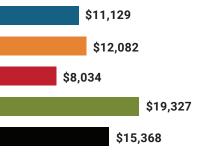

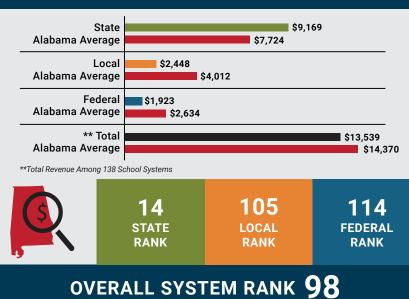






Per-Pupil Revenue Sources

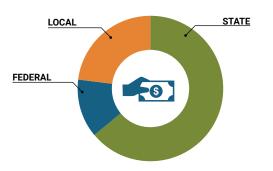
Oneonta City Revenue Sources

How did your school system spend state & local dollars?¹

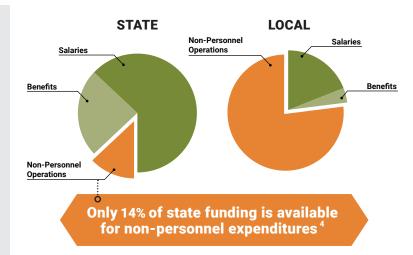
