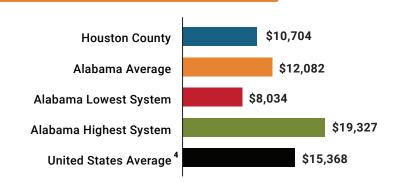

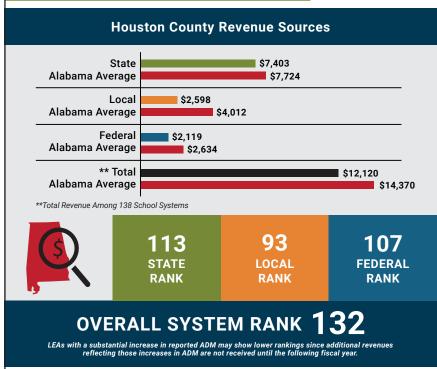

#### **Total Per-Pupil Expenditures** (PPE)

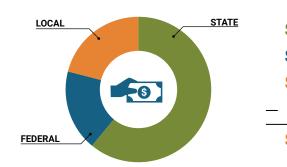


#### **Per-Pupil Revenue Sources**
