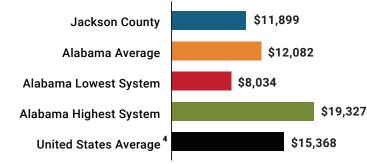

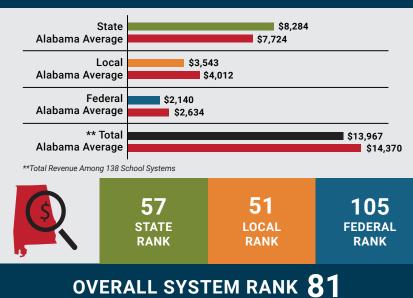

#### **Per-Pupil Revenue Sources**

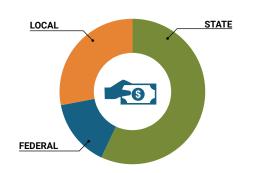
#### Jackson County Revenue Sources

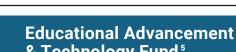
