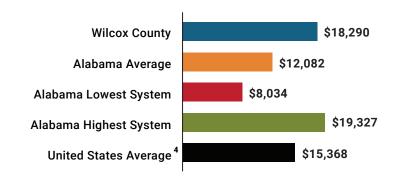

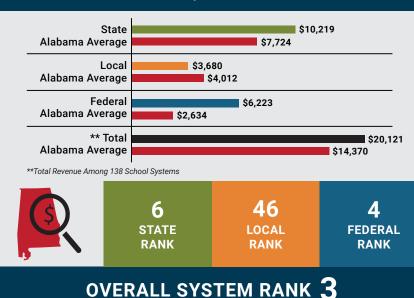

Per-Pupil Revenue Sources

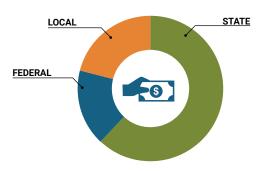
Wilcox County Revenue Sources

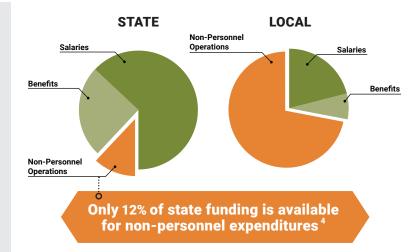
