The AASB A-Team

To annually recognize local school board members who successfully engage in legislative and policy advocacy in their school board service.

<u>Criteria:</u> A nominee's total application will be considered.

While compliance with all criteria is desirable, it is not required.

- 1. Served as a school board member for at least one year.
- Participated in Advocacy events at state and/or federal level.
- 3. Registered as a key contact in AASB's grassroots program for one or more local legislators.
- 4. Developed and sustained a meaningful relationship with one or more local policy makers during the year.
- 5. Consistently contacted policy makers on priority AASB issues and responded to AASB on Calls-to-Action.
- 6. Provided follow-up information to AASB on communications with policy makers.
- 7. Engaged policy makers in school system activities.
- 8. Received local school board support for the recognition through a letter of endorsement by the board president or designee.

Nomination and Selection

- 1. An individual may be self-nominated, nominated by a fellow board member, the full school board or superintendent.
- 2. Nominations must be in the format/form designated by AASB.
- The AASB Executive Director will appoint a selection panel composed of current or former school board members, AASB Governmental Relations staff and/or others with skills or knowledge in successful advocacy.
- The selection panel will review nominee applications and select one or more award recipients based on published criteria.
- 5. The panel will consider the overall impact of the nominee.
- 6. The selected A-Team members will be notified and recognized during the AASB annual convention.
