Senate Leadership Urges SBOE to Share Plans, Vision for Improving Education

Alabama Senate Pro Tem Greg Reed and Senate Minority Leader Bobby Singleton urged the State Board of Education during Thursday's work session to better communicate the department's plans to improve education and assist underperforming schools.

"In the last 10 years or so, we have not gotten any real strong policy out of the State Board; it's always been the Legislature who has been pushing the education agenda," Singleton said. "I want to see education get in front of education again."

Reed, who emphasized the importance of education as a recruitment factor in bringing business to the state, said it's lawmakers who are being asked questions about the plans and actions underway for improving education. He said more statistical data and details are needed from the department to demonstrate progress being made.

Other work session discussion included proposed ESSA amendments and a presentation about free cyber security assistance the Alabama Supercomputer Authority provides to K-12 school systems.

The board meeting featured recognition of 122 schools named Purple Star Schools for their support of military families.






May 4: Common Audit Mistakes
