SBOE Discusses ETF FY24 Budget, Numeracy Act and Proposed Graduation Requirement Updates

The State Board of Education reviewed the FY24 ETF budget request at its Thursday, August 11 work session. The budget requested includes a nearly \$800 million increase over last year's budget.

Deputy Superintendent Dr. Brandon Payne presented the FY24 budget line by line, while State Superintendent of Education Dr. Eric Mackey facilitated discussion with board members. Mackey asked board members to provide feedback and then discuss budget items with superintendents in their districts. The board will hold its formal budget discussion during the September work session, and Mackey added some budget figures presented Thursday could be adjusted based on SBOE suggestions and input from AASB and School Superintendents of Alabama (SSA).

The budget must be approved in October to meet the November 1 deadline for submission to the governor.

Other board meeting and work session highlights included discussion on updates related to the Alabama Numeracy Act and a proposed rule adoption that would require students to earn a College and Career Readiness indicator as a graduation requirement.

President-Elect and District Director Nominations

Self-nominations are being accepted for AASB president-elect for 2023. Both the president and president-elect serve a one-year term. AASB bylaws call for president-elect candidates to have served on AASB's Board of Directors; however, such service need not be consecutive to the individual's candidacy for or term of elective office. <u>Nomination</u> <u>forms</u> must be postmarked or received by Sept. 1.

AASB also is holding director elections for Districts 1, 3, 5, 7 and 9. Nominations must be made in writing and postmarked or received by Sept. 1. District directors serve two-year terms and can serve two, complete terms. Learn more.
