# Education Leaders Share Plans to Address Math Proficiency, Teacher Shortages

Math achievement, teacher shortages and the new Career and Technical Education Course of Study were the focus of the Alabama State Board of Education's meeting and work session Thursday.

Alabama Math, Science, and Technology Initiative (AMSTI) Director Dr. Sandy Ledwell presented an update at the work session on how the ALSDE is supporting math proficiency. The board expressed concerns during last month's meeting with low math proficiency results on the ACAP.

State Superintendent of Education Dr. Eric Mackey said coaching is the key to improve math achievement and reminded the board about plans to increase the number of math coaches by 220 in K-5 schools, if approved in the FY23 budget request. The state currently has 145 elementary math coaches and 32 secondary coaches.

ALSDE Chief of Staff Chuck Marcum provided an update from the Teacher Preparation and Certification work group he is leading to address the teacher shortage. The group is tasked with exploring short- and long-term recommendations for educator preparation and certification to increase the number of teacher applicants in the state.

Other SBOE meeting and work session news included discussion on the Career and Technical Education Course of Study, passage of a resolution supporting local decision making related to COVID-19 protocols and the textbook law.


## DELEGATE ASSEMBLY REPORT

AASB's 2021 Delegate Assembly, the association's annual business meeting, was held on Thursday, December 2 at the Hyatt Regency-Wynfrey Hotel in Hoover. After President Shannon Cauley delivered the President's Report to the Assembly, the Assembly took the following actions:

- Adopted the Nominating Committee's Report naming Mary Hooks (Macon County) as President-Elect;
- Adopted the Bylaws Committee Report which regulates the Association's governance; and

#### FCPA Report Deadline Jan. 31

Elected school board members and elected superintendents have unit Jan. 31 to file their annual Fair Campaign Practices Act reports. The report, which details contributions to and expenditures by elected officials and candidates in 2021, is available through the Alabama Secretary of State's Office and local probate judges' offices and can be downloaded from the Secretary of State's website. In addition, anyone who ran for public office in 2021 and has not yet dissolved his or her election committee must file a report. Local officials should file with their probate judge; state officials file with the Secretary of State.
