SBOE Votes to Take No Action on K-3 ELA Textbook Recommendations, Discusses Pending Ed Legislation

The State Board of Education voted Thursday to adopt State Textbook Committee recommendations for English/language arts (ELA) textbooks, grades 4-12, while approving another resolution to take no action on the committee's recommendations for adoption of ELA textbooks, grades K-3.

Other board meeting action included the adoption of a new Alabama Administrative Code rule allowing the State Department of Education to use an electronic signature program for state documents and announcement of intent to adopt an amended rule changing permit and inspection requirements for school facilities.

The work session following Thursday's meeting included robust discussion about education-related bills filed this legislative session and the department's interactions with lawmakers, something Wayne Reynolds (District 8) described as "the elephant in the room."

Other work session discussion included:

- Updates from ALSDE staff about personnel developments and training programs and supports for schools dealing with classroom behavior problems and disruptions.
- Intent to adopt administrative code changes related to student health services and extended learning opportunities.
