State's New Career Simulator Truck to Bring Technical Training to Rural, Underserved Schools

The Alabama State Board of Education has unveiled plans for a mobile Career & Technical Training hub – an 18-wheeler equipped with virtual reality and simulation technology. Announced during the SBOE's Thursday work session, the specialized truck will allow students to experience various career paths firsthand, from advanced manufacturing to underwater welding, with a strategic focus on serving schools with limited access to traditional CTE programs.

Set for full deployment in the 2025-26 school year, this initiative will connect students with high-demand career opportunities while working alongside local industry partners.

In other news from the SBOE's January meeting and work session, the board bid farewell to two departing members, including:

- **Stephanie Bell** (District 3) concluded her tenure as the longest-serving state board of education member in both Alabama history and nationally, having served since 1994.
- **Belinda McRae** (District 7) also was recognized for her four years of service on the SBOE and for her previous role as the first woman to serve on the Marion County Board of Education.

New SBOE members Kelley Mooney and Allen Long will be sworn in later this month during the board's retreat.

Other key issues discussed Thursday included the board announcing its intent to change the Alabama Administrative Code pertaining to teacher preparation programs, plans to update digital K-12 literacy standards, and the announcement of the Legislative School Performance Recognition Program, which will distribute \$250,000 in stipends to high-performing and most-improved schools across the state.
