

Tips for Effective Advocacy

KEEP IT SIMPLE

Most issues can be explained. A position can be stated in just a few sentences.

Explain pros and/or cons of legislation (ETF budget, etc.) as it relates to your local school system. Give specific examples.

BE THE "EDUCATOR"

Remember, YOU are the subject matter expert. Tell YOUR story.

When everything is important, nothing is important. Don't inundate. Prioritize top 3 issues.

SET PRIORITIES

5 SPEAK UP

Be heard on key public education issues. Action or inaction matters.



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6 BE DIRECT

Be clear with specific requests. Ask for a position or action, i.e. vote "yes" or vote "no". Please amend, etc.

There is power in numbers. Remind legislators of education support or opposition on an issue.

JOIN FORCES

BE RESPECTFUL

ALWAYS be courteous and professional. In politics, there are no permanent friends and no permanent enemies.

Call, text, schedule a meeting. Invite elected officials to visit your local schools and showcase the positives. Address the challenges.

BE THE POINT OF CONTACT
