SBOE Meeting and Work Session Focus on FY22 Budget and COVID-19 Concerns, Funding

The State Board of Education approved its \$5.2 billion FY22 education budget request at its meeting Thursday, Oct 8. The budget request, a \$459 million increase over FY21, was discussed at last month's work session and includes funding increases for school nurses, transportation, Alabama Literacy Act and AMSTI supports, Career and Technology Education, mental health and more. The request now goes to Gov. Kay Ivey who must submit her proposal to the legislature when it convenes in February 2021.

Other meeting and work session highlights included an update on the number of teachers completing professional development on the science of reading or LETRS training, challenges and concerns facing schools amid the pandemic, federal COVID-19 relief funding and more. In addition, the board received an update from the state textbook committee for K-12 mathematics.

A recent Alabama Daily News article explained that both Alabama's general fund and education budgets will end this fiscal year able to tuck money away into reserve accounts, placing the state in what is being described as an "enviable" position compared to many other states amid the COVID-19 pandemic.

AASB was proud to be a lead advocate to enact the 2011 ETF Rolling Reserve Act, which created a budgeting process and stabilization fund that is now being credited with keeping the education budget healthy during the current economic downturn.




DELEGATE/ALTERNATE NAMES
